NEIL SIMON

Neil Simon is one of America's most successful playwrights, certainly in financial terms. His stage plays are performed regularly all over the world.

Simon grew up in New York and by the age of 21 was writing for radio and television and throughout the Fifties he wrote for comedians such as Phil Silvers and Jerry Lewis.

Come Blow Your Horn was Simon's first Broadway hit in 1961, followed by Little Mo in 1962. However it was Barefoot in the Park in 1963 that bought him critical acclaim. Other successes include The Odd Couple (1965), Plaza Suite (1968), Last of the Red Hot Lovers (1968), The Sunshine Boys (1972), and California Suite (1976).

His characters were often detailed portrayals of contemporary New Yorkers facing real problems, the comedy arising from them and their situations. Neil Simon is observant, accurate and consequently funny - seriously funny.

"The way I see things life is both sad and funny, I can't imagine a comical situation that isn't at the same time also painful. I used to ask myself: What is a humorous situation? Now I ask, what is a sad situation and how can I tell it humorously?"
