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ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Sandy Wilson was born in 1924 and educated at Harrow and Oxford. He began his career as a writer of revue sketches for shows such as 'Slings and Arrows' (1948) and 'Oranges and Lemons' (1949).

'The Boy Friend' (1953) was written for The Players' Theatre where it was first performed. Very much a small-scale, small-budget enterprise; no-one could have predicted its enormous success. The relatively-unknown Anne Rodgers was a last-minute choice as Polly and Joan Sterndale Bennett was Madame Dubonnet. On transfer to the West End it ran for five years.

Success on Broadway followed where Julie Andrews played Polly and Millicent Martin, Nancy. Transferred at last to celluloid it was directed by Ken Russell with Twiggy a rather unlikely Polly Browne.

Sadly, Sandy Wilson never equalled his 1953 triumph. 'The Buccaneer' (1956), a fantasy set in the office of a boys' magazine and 'Valmouth' (1958) are now almost completely forgotten. 'Divorce Me Darling' (1965) tried to do for the 1930's what 'The Boy Friend' did for the 1920's but not to such great effect.

It is difficult to say why 'The Boy Friend' remains so popular. Perhaps Sandy Wilson in his attempt to satirise 1920's musical comedy had borrowed from something essentially winning. Winning in its dizzy charm, its frantic optimism and its unashamed sentimentality. Just the sort of tonic for the 1950's and perhaps for the 1980's.
