James Freeman

James has performed in productions for many local companies including Porthill Players, Newcastle Players, Studio One, Trentham Shakespeare Company, Alsager Community Theatre, Derby Shakespeare Company, North Staffs Operatic Society, Newcastle Operatic Society, Stage Productions and Scarlett Theatre.

He has played a wide range of roles from serious drama to high farce, from Shakespeare to musicals, in classic plays to modern masterpieces and everything in between! These have been at venues across the region including The Victoria Hall, Regent Theatre, Stafford Playhouse, The Mitchell Arts Centre, Derby Guild Hall and open-air at Trentham Gardens and Little Morton Hall.

James has performed in every season of the Rep Players for the last 27 years! His favourite roles for the Players included Raleigh in JOURNEY'S END, Oswald in GHOSTS, Donal in DAYS OF WINE & ROSES, Merrick in THE ELEPHANT MAN, John Hall in THE HERBAL BED, Hannay in THE 39 STEPS, Bernard in DON'T DRESS FOR DINNER and, most recently, Jack Manningham in last year's production of GASLIGHT.

James has also directed several Rep Players productions: HUMBLE BOY and MY BOY JACK, being personal favourites. He has also directed many musical theatre productions including BARNUM, CHICAGO, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF and THE HUNCHBACK OF NOTRE DAME. He is really looking forward to appearing in the "brilliantly written GOD OF CARNAGE, alongside such an incredibly talented cast."

Leo has been treading the amateur boards across Staffordshire for nearly 20 years now, having moved up from Kent back in 2005. He has performed in several plays at The Rep, including Alan Ayckbourn's TIME OF MY LIFE (2015), David Haig's MY BOY JACK and Graham Linehan's THE LADYKILLERS in 2016, Jessica Swale's Nell Gwynn in 2018 (which was also directed by David Bryan). Delighted to be involved in GOD OF CARNAGE, Leo has said

#### DIRECTOR TEAM





David Bryan

David has been a member of The Stoke Rep Players for many years. He's appeared over the years in several plays including THE CRUCIBLE by Arthur Miller in 1993, Alfred Doolittle in George Bernard Shaw's PYGMALION, Thomas Cromwell in A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS.

He played Toad in a production of WIND IN THE WILLOWS in 1999—a joint cast of The Rep Players and The Young Rep. He appeared in a couple of Shakespeare plays namely TWELFTH NIGHT (2003) and MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING (2009).

In 2017 The Rep staged a production of Willy Russell's BREEZE-BLOCK PARK in which David played Assistant Director, Sarah Stockdale's sister; Caroline Keen and James Freeman also appeared in the production — making GOD OF CARNAGE somewhat of a reunion!

David has also directed several plays for The Rep including Tennessee Williams' THE GLASS MENAGERIE and another Willy Russell classic — EDUCATING RITA amongst others.

Sarah began acting and directing at university and appeared in two productions at the Edinburgh Fringe. Whilst living in Surrey for over 20 years she worked with a couple of theatre groups involved in both directing and acting in a variety of roles, the highlight of which was playing the role of Elizabeth Proctor in THE CRUCIBLE.

She joined Stoke Rep, having moved back to Shropshire, at the end of 2009. Her first acting role for The Rep Players was in Neil Simon's RUMORS. Over the years she has gone on to appear in a variety of productions including ALLO, ALLO!, THE MERRY WIVES OF WINDSOR and loved the role of M'Lynn in STEEL MAGNOLIAS.

Sarah's all time favourite role was in Patrick Barlow's 39 STEPS in which she played all three female characters, which she says was "enormous fun, but totally exhausting."

She has directed for The Players on a number of occasions including the ghost story, TURN OF THE SCREW, Noel Coward's WAITING IN THE WINGS and most recently GASLIGHT by Patrick Hamilton.

#### THE AUTHOR



GOD OF CARNAGE was written by French playwright, actress, novelist and screenwriter Yasmina Reza. She was born in 1954 to Jewish parents — her father was Russian and her mother Hungarian. During the Nazi occupation, her father was deported from Nice to Drancy internment camp.

At the beginning of her career, Reza acted in several plays by Molière and Marivaux as well as newly written plays.

In 1987, she wrote CONVERSATIONS AFTER A BURIAL, which won the Molière Award (the French equivalent of the Tony Award) for Best Author. In the late 1980s Reza translated Roman Polanski's stage version of Kafka's METAMORPHOSIS. Her second play, WINTER CROSSING, won the 1990 Molière Award for Best Fringe Production, and her next play, THE UNEXPECTED MAN, enjoyed successful productions in several countries.

In 1994, ART premièred in Paris and went on to win the Molière Award for Best Author. Since then it has been produced internationally and translated and performed in over 30 languages. The London production received Laurence Olivier Award and Evening Standard Awards. It also won the Tony Award for Best Play. TROIS VERSIONS DE LA VIE (LIFE X 3) has been produced in Europe, North America and Australia. Screenwriting credits include SEE YOU TOMOR-ROW, directed by Reza's then-partner Didier Martiny.

Her first novel, HAMMERKLAVIER, was published in 1997 and another work of fiction, UNE DÉSOLATION, was published in 2001. L'AUBE LE SOIR OU LA NUIT (DAWN EVENING OR NIGHT), written in 2007 after a year of following the campaign of Nicolas Sarkozy, caused a sensation in France.

In November 2007 LE DIEU DU CARNAGE (GOD OF CARNAGE), received a Viennese Nestroy Theatre Prize. It opened in London in March 2008, it was translated by Christopher Hampton. The London production won the Laurence Olivier Award for Best New Comedy, which Hampton accepted on her behalf.

Her 2016 novel, BABYLONE, received the Prix Renaudot. The English version, translated by Linda Asher, was published by Seven Stories Press in 2018



#### THE TRANSLATOR



Christopher Hampton is a British playwright, screenwriter and film director born in 1946 in Portugal.

His most famous plays are LES LIAISONS DANGEREUSES (1988) (from the book of the same title), an adaptation of Ian McEwan's ATONEMENT (2007) and THE FATHER (2020).

He has received numerous awards for his work, including an Academy Award for Best Adapted Screenplay.

He was appointed Commander of the Order of the British Empire (CBE) in 1999 and awarded Knight Bachelor of the Order of the British Empire in the 2020 Queen's New Years Honours List for his services to Drama.

From 1964, Hampton read German and French at New College, Oxford, as a Sacher Scholar. He graduated with a starred First Class Degree in 1968.

He became involved in the theatre while at Oxford University. The Oxford University Dramatic Society performed his first play WHEN DID YOU LAST SEE MY MOTHER?, about adolescent homosexuality which he drew from his own experiences. The play was performed at the Royal Court Theatre in London, and in 1966 was transferred to the Comedy Theatre, Hampton was the youngest writer in the modern era to have a play performed in the West End.

Hampton's work on screenplays for the cinema also began around this time. He adapted this play for Richard Attenborough and Bryan Forbes, but a film version was never made.


From 1968 to 1970, Hampton worked as the Resident Dramatist at the Royal Court Theatre, and also as the company's literary manager. He continued to write plays. His TOTAL ECLIPSE, about the French poets and lovers Arthur Rimbaud and Paul Verlaine, was turned into a film in 1995 starring Leonardo DiCaprio.

Hampton has had a full and eclectic career including involvement in musicals, librettos, screenwriting and directing films; in addition to these he translated playwrights such as Ibsen and Chekhov, and of course, Yasmina Reza.
